Dear Parent/Carer

I am writing to you to draw your attention to the extensive intervention after school programme (period 6) that is organised to support Year 11 attainment. There are sixteen teaching weeks remaining until the first formal examination and this progress acceleration strategy will be crucial in ensuring that students maximise their potential. The programme is organised on a weekly basis with sessions in a range of core and foundation subjects. The programme includes a combination of one to one, small group and some whole class activities. A summary of the sessions available during Term Two is shown below:

Monday: Art, Drama, Music, DT and ICT, Geography, French

Tuesday: English, Science and GSCE PE **Wednesday:** Maths, History and RS

Thursday: French, Maths Catch Up, Science, Geography

Friday: History, BTEC Sport and geography

Subjects that are providing targeted intervention sessions will invite students on a weekly basis and this information will be published within school, emailed to students and communicated through roll call. In addition to subject specific sessions, the LRC will be open during Monday – Friday for independent study with ICT access. All sessions will commence at 2.15pm and finish at approximately 4.15pm.

Students who attend intervention sessions on a regular basis will be rewarded for their commitment to their studies. The nature of the reward is currently being discussed and agreed by staff and students through the School Council.

Success is based upon a three way partnership between the school, student and parents. Can I therefore please encourage you to support attendance at all sessions. Registers will be taken on a daily basis and I will contact the parents of students who are not attending. It is also important to stress that the Period 6 Programme is not a replacement for independent study and revision.
