





R = Relevant



Attendance

90% is pretty good right? WRONG!

- Some pupils have an attendance rate of around 90%. Most parents and pupils think that this is pretty good.
- If you have a 90% attendance record, it means that you are absent from lessons for the equivalent of one half-day every week.

 Mon Tue Wed Thur Fri
- That's like taking every Wednesday morning off.
- Below 90% falls into the category of 'persistently absent'.
- We have a duty to report persistent absence to the Local Authority. Attending school is a legal requirement



Attendance

It all adds up... Creating gaps

- A 90% attendance rate means that you have missed the equivalent of four whole weeks of lessons in the school year.
- If your attendance rate is at 90% throughout KS3 and KS4 (5 years) you have missed the equivalent of about one half of a school year.
- It's not just the missed lessons... Education builds on existing knowledge, gaps in knowledge and understanding impact pupils accessing new learning going forward.
- Our top performing students last year all had attendance above 96% and our lowest performing students all had attendance below 96%






Attendance What we do:

What you can do:

- Good routines (bedtimes etc)
- Limit technology in bedrooms
- Healthy, balanced diet and plenty of water
- Recognise issues and worries and help them to problem solve
- Don't keep children at home because of problems at school seek help
- See medical professionals about reoccurring or acute illness
- Take holidays during school holidays
- Tell us if your child is going to be absent


