UNIVERSAL CREDIT – Response to ongoing Covid-19



In response to the Covid 19 pandemic and the subsequent increase in claims to Universal Credit and New Style Jobseekers Allowance, DWP is delivering a programme of new targeted provision to support claimants to re-enter employment. Job Entry Targeted Support (JETS) will provide light touch, personalised support for up to 6 months. Participants will continue to be required to fulfil their responsibilities set out and agreed in their DWP Claimant Commitment. This is additional to the support already available via DWP including the Health and Work Programme, New Enterprise Allowance and online support via https://jobhelp.dwp.gov.uk

Jobs from the Kickstart Scheme will be open to people 16-24 years old, who are claiming Universal Credit, and are at risk of long-term unemployment.
