## EVERY MINUTE COUNTS!

Being late makes a big difference and absence from school quickly adds up.
It is important that your child attends school every day and on time. Arriving late to school is unsettling for children and disrupts the start to their day.

First lesson starts prompt at 8:30am - we expect all students in school and ready to start their learning at this time.

| 5 minutes late every day $=3$ days of school lost a year |
| :---: |
| 10 minutes late every day $=6.5$ days of school lost a year |
| 15 minutes late every day $=10$ days of school lost a year |
| 20 minutes late every day $=13$ days of school lost a year |
| 30 minutes late every day $=19$ days of school lost a year |

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
