
Year 5 Experience Day

First Generation Scholars

This term, a group of our determined and forward-thinking students proudly took part in the First-Generation Scholars

Programme — an exciting initiative that supports secondary school students who are the first in their families to consider going to university.

As part of the programme, students had the incredible opportunity to visit Goldsmiths, University of London, where they experienced life on a university campus and met current students and staff aimed at building academic confidence and raising aspirations.



One of the most memorable parts of the programme was a formal graduation ceremony, held at Goldsmiths to celebrate the students' hard work and achievements. Each student received a certificate and recognition for their commitment.

A key academic challenge during the programme involved writing an essay to university standards. Students were asked to research and reflect on the Windrush Generation and how Britain changed as a result of Caribbean migration after World War II. This topic not only developed their historical understanding but also encouraged deep thinking about identity, culture, and the impact of migration on modern Britain.

We are incredibly proud of the students who took part. Their curiosity, hard work, and willingness to take on new experiences are what this programme is all about.

The First-Generation Scholars Programme has opened doors, expanded horizons, and given our students a clearer sense of what's possible. We look forward to seeing how they continue to grow and achieve — both in school and beyond.

Year 7 Tennis Trip

Start of Term Reminders


As we end of the end of the year, here are a few reminders to help you be September ready.
