





Who is the programme for?

Students need to be performing at 7.5 APS to be considered. The programme is aimed at those wishing to secure a place at Oxbridge (Cambridge or Oxford University) or pursue a career in an extremely competitive field. Our focus is on preparing students for the top universities, and specifically entering those degree courses such as Medicine, Dentistry, and Veterinary Science which are very difficult to get into.

In collaboration with Marlborough College, the Scholars Programme offers a unique extra-curricular programme that goes beyond the standard syllabus, ensuring that every student receives a well-rounded education and develops personal experiences that set them apart.

Key components of the Scholars Programme include comprehensive seminars, university visits, academic competitions, online masterclasses, and inspiring guest speakers. Through these elements, we aim to foster academic excellence, critical thinking, and personal development.

- Support with a **Bursary Scholarship of £200** towards student studies.



How to Apply & Entry Requirements

Entry Requirements

We treat all students as individuals and ensure that the advice we give suits their qualifications, interests, career aspirations and skills. To Join, students must gain at least Grade 5 in five or more GCSEs including English and Maths. Students will need to achieve at least Grade 5 in the subjects they wish to study at A Level. If they want to study a new subject, their achievement in a similar GCSE subject will be considered. Those wishing to study a Science based subject and/or Maths must have a Grade 7 in that subject. For entry into the Scholars Programme students should have an average GCSE point score above Grade 7.5.
